Poking fun at the cultural divide, Kashua and his characters play on religious, cultural and political differences to daringly depict the mixed society that is Israel. This show marked a milestone on Israeli television as the first program to present Palestinian characters speaking Arabic on primetime, and it generated great controversy between Arab and Israeli media.

Blue White Future**10,000**

Blue White Future aims at enhancing and making visible the Israeli public's support for a two-state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict in order to preserve Israel's character as a Jewish and democratic state.

B'Tselem: The Israeli Information Center for Human Rights**5,000**

B'Tselem works to document and educate the Israeli public and policymakers about human rights violations in the Occupied Territories and help create a human rights culture in Israel.
